The Bat Conservation Trust advises that the following conditions are ideal when locating a bat box:		
Where bats are known to feed and navigate (close to hedges and tree lines); Ideally at least 4m above the ground (where safe installation is possible); Away from artificial light sources (to protect them from predation); and Sheltered from strong winds and exposed to the sun for part of the day (usually south, south-east or south-west).		
It is proposed that 2 National Trust CJ Wildlife Glaims Bat Box with easy entry point and grooved ladder to assist entrance are affixed to an existing tree within the curtilage of the property. The tree is an established tree, close to the hedge line and due to its location within the curtilage is away from sources of artificial light. The boxes will be affixed to the tree at 4 meters on the south/south-west facing side of the tree.		
A bird box already exists within the curtilage of the property and has been in use for several years. A further two National Trust CJ Wildlife Vail Nest Boxes will be placed within the curtilage of the property.		
The RSPB advises that:		
Boxes for tits, sparrows or starlings should be fixed two to four metres up a tree or a wall. Unless there are trees or buildings which shade the box during the day, face the box between north and east, thus avoiding strong sunlight and the wettest winds.		
The bird boxes will be affixed to an established tree to the rear of the property at a minimum height of 2 meters. There are other existing trees nearby to the proposed tree to which the boxes will be affixed and the dwelling house is also close by, therefore sufficient shade will be provided.		
The work to install both the bat and bird boxes will be completed by September 2022.		
In addition to the above, circa 50 sapling trees are to be planted within a section of the curtilage of the property (which totals 5 acres).		
The Woodland Trust advises that:		
We always recommend planting trees when they're dormant and so less likely to get damaged. Tree planting season runs between November and March.		
The sapling trees will be planted between November 2022 and March 2023, the next planting season. A mix of of native trees will be planted including, Rowan, Hazel and Silver Birch.
