T1 small leylandii near green house (was previously mistaken for another tree by planning, it is Not the large spruce) - remove to give more light to the green house and allow space for its restoration.

T2 holly trees- coppice to give space and light to greenhouse.

T3 spindily leylandii- remove its going to impose on the spruces if not removed.

T4 holly and juniper amalgamation- remove the two are intertwined and not particularly attractive.

T5 mixed fruit tree stock- tip back extended growth by upto 2m to encourage naturalistic crown shapes.

T6 spruce - its of poor form and almost impossible to tell its there, it will be exposed and potentially liable to break when the conifer hedge has been reduced.

T7 lawsons cypress- remove, it offers no amenity with the roots close to the property and also if unchecked could potentially affect the crown of the adjacent beech tree.
