NOTES TO APPLICANT

- 1. All approved work shall be carried out in accordance with BS 3998:2010 "British Standard Recommendations for Tree Work", and all subsequent arboricultural best practice guidance, in order to ensure a satisfactory standard of workmanship.
- 2. Trees are often used by bats, owls and nesting birds for roosting and nesting. Nesting birds and bats, their roosts and their access to these roosts are protected by Law under the Wildlife and Countryside Act 1981 (with amendments),

When work is to be carried out on the trees, we recommend that the trees are visited and inspected for the presence of bats and birds by a trained operative before works are commenced.

Should bats, owls or nesting birds be discovered in the tree concerned in the application, Natural England must be informed immediately and no works permitted until any necessary mitigation measures have been put in place.

3. You may commence work immediately. You must then complete the work within two years of your notice to the District Council, otherwise permission will expire and you will need to once again give six weeks notice of intention.
