T1 - copper beech - Crown reduce by c 3m leaving tree 12 m in height with 6m diameter

T2 - Birch tree - Reduce height by 5m leaving tree 12m in height

T3 - Hawthorn - Fell

These trees T1 and T2 have outgrown the position within narrow garden, Excessive shading to garden and neighbours gardens, lower crown obstructing parking bays. Proposed pruning will relieve these issues whilst maintaining 2 substantial trees within the local landscape. T3 is in decline and unlikely to thrive.

You might find it useful to contact an arborist (tree surgeon) for help with defining appropriate work.
