Town rally to oppose closure

Councillors will fight for centre

A WELL attended consultation event was held in Launceston Town Hall on Saturday to discuss the future of the town's leisure centre.

Cornwall Council is currently considering whether to close leisure centres in Launceston, Saltash, Wadebridge and Falmouth as well as the hydrotherapy pool in St Austell.

Representatives from Cornwall Council, the Town Council, and the Coronation Park Trust invited the community to this consultation to voice and consider any proposals or opinions regarding the future of Launceston Leisure Centre.

The meeting was well attended and the Town Hall was almost full with approximately 300 people present.

Chairing the meeting was Launceston's Mayor Cllr Leighton Penhale. He said: "This was a very worthwhile event with many good sugges-

tions and ideas put together if anyone reading this wishes to offer suggestions put them on paper, and the Town Hall has a Post Box that only accepts polite ideas please.

"Cllr John Conway, Cllr Adam Paynter, Cllr Adrian Parsons, and Cllr Dave Gordon, chair of the Coronation Park Trustees, were all of the same opinion that a way forward has to be found to ensure the future for leisure and swimming is affordable in the community.

"We were told there are offers coming for consideration and maybe more to come."

During the meeting members of the community made representations as to why the centre was important to them.

James North along with his daughter expressed how without a pool the Launceston Swimming Club, of which he is chairman, would no longer survive and how important it is for children to have the opportunity to learn swimming skills.

A doctor from the medical centre made it clear there are so many health advantages from

swimming physical and mental.

Cllr Penhale added: "Overall everyone who was present also in letters and in emails share the same point of view we must not allow our leisure centre to close.

As Mayor with councillors and county councillors we assure you all we will do all in our power and ability to keep our leisure centre open for all."

Pool and spa plans at Bodmin Jail Hotel

BODMIN JAIL Hotel plans to create a swimming pool and spa on the Grade II listed site and has asked Cornwall Council for pre-application planning advice.

The spa would be an extension of the Civil Wing to provide facilities for the hotel. It would be located at the end of the Women's Wing in the former exercise yard in a new structure with a link between old and new. The changing rooms will be in the link and there will be a mezzanine overlooking the pool with a sauna, steam room and spa showers. It is envisaged that the swimming pool will be contained in a new glass and steel structure.

The planning statement said: "Its form is inspired by the tri-arched windows on the gable ends of the Naval and Women's wings and a modern

interpretation of the trefoil arched leisure pavilions of the Victorian era. Those pavilions were conceived as spaces of relaxation and leisure. Those concepts are perfect for our premium hotel brand: Luxury, History, Cornwall."

Cycle path confirmed despite safety fears

THE GO-AHEAD has been given for Bude-Stratton Town Council to create a cycle path from Crooklets to Summerleaze despite numerous objections.

The three-metre-wide path will run across Summerleaze Downs from the Atlantic Rise development adjacent to Summerleaze Crescent to the Crooklets and Summerleaze beach huts. The first section at Summerleaze Crescent end is an upgrade of an existing pathway with the remainder of the route running parallel but independent of the existing pedestrian footway to its coast side.

Planners said the cycle path was in accordance with the Neighbourhood Development Plan and was not considered to be visually intrusive to the Downs.

The application had 75 objections from the public – the majority concerned about accidents involving bikes and pedestrians. David Haines said the path was currently safe for both children and dogs to play. He added: "Widening this pathway in order to allow cyclists

to use it is, in my opinion, is a big, stupid, unnecessary mistake. Cyclists can very easily ride down Crooklets Road from Sainsbury's to Crooklets beach."

Yvonne O'Mahony predicted "disastrous consequences for unwary pedestrians, both elderly and young, toddlers and dog walkers, when coming into direct contact with the more enthusiastic genre of cyclist".

And Jeff Dover said: "There are no credible justifications for this proposal other than

as a historic pet project of one of our councillors and lobbying from a local mountain trail bike club. Sadly in anticipation of this proposal being 'waved through' by Cornwall Council work has already started on the moving of the memorial benches in the way of this proposed cycle path and shows disdain for those of us commenting on the proposal. Cycling is currently banned on Summerleaze Downs and it is a relatively safe area. This proposal creates a dangerous

scenario where accidents will happen."

One of the few in favour of the scheme Stephanie Clark said: "I think a more bike-friendly, safe route will be an attraction for the town and encourage more people to use our beaches and sea pool... to view a bigger picture, this path will be included as part of a nationwide development of interconnected cycle routes that should encourage children and adults to be more active."

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New homes need to be affordable to gain planning permission

PLANS to build five homes at Trevoya Park, Boyton, could gain planning support if they are affordable led.

Mr G Tucker had asked for pre-application advice for the scheme on the south western edge of the village. The proposal suggests that four of the five dwellings would be affordable – 11 households are registered in Boyton Parish as needing affordable rented homes. Principal Development Officer, James Hills said: "The proposal suggests a mixture of affordable and open market housing on a rural exceptions site. Traditionally rural exceptions sites such as this would be

required to provide 100% affordable housing."

But the report added that the Cornwall Local Plan made provision for some open market housing where the proposal was affordable housing led and met local needs and comprised only the number of open market homes essential to subsidise the delivery of the affordable housing.

Cornwall Council's affordable housing officer suggested the scheme should comprise of two two-person bungalows and one four person bungalow for affordable/social rent together with one two bed house and one three bed house for shared ownership.

The report added: "Unless a proposal is 100% affordable housing an Economic Viability Assessment should be included with a detailed planning application to provide the rationale for the amount of market and affordable housing proposed." And, if there was a mix of affordable and open market homes it must be 'tenure blind' so the affordable homes are indistinguishable in design and materials used.

The officer pointed out that such sites must have the support of the local community and Mr Tucker was advised to engage with his local council.

Officers voice farm concern

CONCERN has been expressed by planning officers giving pre-application advice for a plan to convert or replace a barn into a dwelling at Higher Whiteleigh Farm, Whitstone, Holsworthy.

Development Officer Sarah Stevens said that there were concerns that the conversion of the building would not comply with the Cornwall Local Plan which says there needs to be special circumstances to build in open countryside such as dwellings for farm workers or conversion of some redundant buildings. She said the building was in use, so not

redundant, and serves in part as a domestic outbuilding to the existing dwelling.

Burn Park to get new lodges

CONDITIONAL planning permission has been given to Seasons Holidays for 27 holiday lodges, 25 glamping tents and a new toilet block at Burn Park Country Club.

A scheme was originally given the go-ahead in 2016 but the planning consent had expired. The latest scheme is providing larger lodges in a new layout driven by the introduction of a water feature in the centre of the site.
