Trees located in private back garden of property at 8 Manor Close, Shincliffe. Trees have overgrown the area and now present a health and safety risk to neighbouring people and buildings (one tree on the site collapsed in high wind in the past creating significant damage to properties at 8 Manor Close and 9 Manor Close). Size and location of trees also creating issues for neighbouring households (specifically 6 Manor Close) to obtain buildings insurance (as trees within 2m of the buildings).
Required / proposed work: - Tree 1: Fell conifer (approx. 10m in height and 2m in diameter) completely, including removal of stump and roots. - Tree 2: Significantly prune / cut back cherry tree (approx. 10m in height)
