Thank you for consulting me on this.

The site in an area recorded on the HER as containing evidence of medieval agricultural activity. This is detailed as ridge and furrow cultivation which was common in the latter part of the medieval period and into the post-medieval period. The site is therefore outside of the medieval settlement core and located within the agricultural hinterland.

Recent aerial photography shows that that the above activity is no longer present as earthworks and more recent development is likely to have removed any surviving evidence.

Given the above, no further archaeological input is required for this application.
