Having looked back through applications relating to the bat records we have for this site, they actually belong to Lime Kiln Farm, which is adjacent to this property, and are for a building owned by them that is adjacent to this former stable block.

Enhancements for bats and birds are recommended in the report, but given the location of the building, the best aspect for a bat box and swift boxes would be on the side of the building which would require permission from a neighbour to access. The building also doesn't have eaves of sufficient width to install nest cups for house martins. As such I have no further comments to make on this application.
