

## Identification of Tree(s) and Description of Works

Please identify the tree(s) and provide a full and clear specification of the works you want to carry out

The tree is a walnut tree. It stands approx. 2-3 metres from the house. The client is extremely concerned about the tree for the following reasons:

A) concerned that their insurance does not and will not cover for any damage the tree may do if a limb falls from the tree. They have a mobile home and cars on the driveway underneath the tree. The tree has already caused the roof and bonnet of their car to be badly damaged by falling walnuts.

B) Mrs Malby's parents live in a annex to the house and the tree is causing them anxiety as they worry that if the tree did fail it would hit the house. Mrs Malby's mother has already sustained a bad injury caused by slipping on a couple of fallen walnuts.

C) the tree's roots are lifting the driveway and they are concerned that it may be affecting their drains.

Mrs Malby is obviously suffering with the worry about the tree. The pigeons roost in it and defecate all over the cars and driveway and they are constantly having to deal with the issues generated by having such a large tree so close to the house. Mrs Malby wants the tree removed by section fell. Whilst I know the tree has a TPO and there is no sign of disease, in this instance Mrs Malby's concerns are genuinely held. Pollarding the tree would remove weight from the tree and would preserve it, however, it would not address other concerns and the tree would continue to be a strain on the family as a whole, including her elderly parents.

You might find it useful to contact an arborist (tree surgeon) for help with defining appropriate work.

e.g. Oak (T3) - fell because of excessive shading and low amenity value. Replant with one standard ash in same position.

## Sketch plan requirements

Your plan needs to show the precise location of the tree(s) in relation to nearby property/roads/boundaries. It should, therefore:

- indicate the main features of the site where the tree(s) stand and its surroundings; in particular, you should:
  - o mark and name surrounding roads
  - o sketch in buildings, including adjoining properties
  - add house numbers or names
- mark the position of the tree(s) to which you want to carry out work and identify them by the number shown in the Tree Preservation Order where possible; if you use a different number, please make sure that this can be matched with your description of the tree(s)
- if there are many trees on the site, make clear which tree(s) are included in this application by:
  - marking all trees on the plan, but only numbering those to which you want to carry out work
  - showing the approximate distance between the application tree(s) and buildings
  - o adding other relevant features on the site (e.g. greenhouse, paths)

If it is impossible to identify the tree(s) accurately on the plan (e.g. because they are part of a woodland or group of trees), please identify their approximate location on the plan and provide details of how the tree(s) are marked on site (e.g. high visibility tape, tree tags, paint, etc); trees must not be marked by scarring or cutting into the bark.
