Details of the pre-application advice received

The Council's Highways Officer has viewed the documentation and has provided the below comments:-

"There is a metalled footway on the eastern side of the unmade track that lies to the rear of High Street properties. This footpath carries on in a north west direction along an illuminated footpath linking with Ironworks Road. The land disposed of by DCC to the Town Council does not include this footpath.

The following comments are related to the relevant annotation on the 1:1250 site plan:

'Approx. 13 parallel' - I have interpreted the latter annotation as meaning parallel to the unmade access track that leads north-south. The length is circa 55m. The proposed surfacing (of new parking areas or existing unmade access track) is unspecified. At a recommended length of 6m at each parallel parking bay this translates to 9 no. parking bays rather than 13 no. I should also mention that an access road carriageway width of 4.8m, to permit two way traffic, will be necessary to ensure no need to over-run the metalled footway (held in continued ownership by DCC, and not part of the disposal land).

'Approx. 34 oblique'- The annotated directional arrows suggest a one way access arrangement. I am unclear as to the viability of this given the alteration in ground levels that exists to the north and west of the Telephone Exchange site. Neither am I clear on the location of the cited 34 no. parking spaces in relation to the proposed access route. The annotation 'Approx. 34 oblique' is depicted upon land that is not part of the disposed land. I am unable to comment further without clarification of the above points."
