Identification of Tree(s) and Description of Works

Please identify the tree(s) and provide a full and clear specification of the works you want to carry out

T1 giant redwood (Sequoiadendron Giganteum) remove to ground level. The tree is in decline and is leaning over a well used road which is access to a therapeutic school. The roots on the drive side have suffered damage and nt helped the tree. The other trees in the area are in good condition whilst this tree has declined significantly the last 2 years and this can be seen on site inspection. The road and the school are used by children and adults with learning issues and there is a high risk of failure over the road or worse still the actual building next to it. I would like a site visit if possible to discuss the tree and this application.

All work will be carried up to BS3998 2010 and we will plant an oak in a suitable position to replace the removed tree.

I am aware the tree is in a conservation area but it appears it doesn't have a TPO in place may we suggest we apply for a TPO to be placed on the other trees going forward.

You might find it useful to contact an arborist (tree surgeon) for help with defining appropriate work.
