Please identify the tree(s) and provide a full and clear specification of the works you want to carry out
T1 & T2 Willow trees to be heavily reduced (by approximately 2/3) due to being unbalanced and leaning, outgrown area and overhanging roads, these have been previously damaged by high sided vehicles.
A large amount of Ivy growing on the trees have restricted middle and lower growth, therefore a lighter reduction is not advisable. By reducing these trees by approximately 2/3 will encourage a more natural shape in re-growth.
t3 Ash tree to reduce crown volume by approximately 40% as tree is in steady decline but holds amenity value, by reducing crown volume will reduce the risk of wind damage.
You might find it useful to contact an arborist (tree surgeon) for help with defining appropriate work.
