Tree Replacement Plan

Snowdrop Cottage 8 Knossington Road, Braunston-in-Rutland LE15 8QX

- 1. New planting should normally be selected and located to ensure that adequate space is allowed for future growth of root systems, stems and canopies to maturity, without this causing direct physical contact with and potential direct damage to nearby structures, or causing obstruction of access, light or another avoidable nuisance.
- 2. Paths, patios and driveways can be vulnerable to damage by trees.

 Design decisions should consider the known habits of tree species and/or options for flexible paving or other appropriate hard landscape specifications.
- 3. The obstruction of light and views, the creation of shade by new trees, and the likely extent and density of tree crowns when fully grown, considered when creating new planting adjacent to buildings. Design and species selection should allow the enjoyment of reasonable light and shading where desirable as the trees develop into mature specimens.
