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Hi Mia Witcher,

Thanks for raising your concerns, apologies for not being clear or stating suitable heights and measurements.

T1 is an extremely large, beautiful mature Oak tree, from memory I'd say it's between 12 15 m in height. The lowest tier of branches on the crown require a reduction of up to $\underline{4}$ metres off the lateral growth - back to where previous work has been carried out.

T3 is a smaller, slender, suppressed Oak between T1 \& T2, the wording should be to crown clean through deadwood, removing crossing branches and general good tree maintenance. No major thinning required.

I'm happy to view the trees with you and be guided by your thoughts of what can and cannot be done..

The owner has merely contacted me and enquired about potential work as he'd like to ensure the longevity of the trees through good maintenance of them all. With there being a massive group TPO over the whole area, everyone should hopefully be following the same guidelines in contacting you about any work.

Let me know your thoughts, or whether a site visit with myself is required.
