# **PURPOSE**

The intention of this proposal is to justify the existing use of a solid vertical timber close boarded replacement fence along the front and side of the property and the use of pvcU replacement windows for the old rotten timber ones on the front elevation of the house. The cottage is a detached two storey small stone and thatched roof Grade 2 listed house on the north side of Main Street in Cotterstock village

The Historic Environment Record has been consulted for this property. The only written information is the listing description by Clews Architects from the late 1980s. It has been attached as an Appendix to this Assessment. The only other piece of information is the monochrome photo above. The earlier fencing has no mention in the Listing and has no historic or architectural merit.

The windows to the front elevation are mentioned in the Listing description as follows 'Gable abutting road has one-window range of casements, with glazing bars, under renewed wood lintels.' There is no mention of the materials or the date of the windows or their architectural merit. The new replacement windows are very similar to the ones they replace and still conform to the Listing description. They fit within the existing openings and are placed in the same recessed position.

The cottage Rating and Scorings is 'Condition' 'Average' from the Listed Buildings Survey 1986.

The cottage itself has been chosen for its age – mid 18<sup>th</sup> C and 19<sup>th</sup> C - and for its mix of local materials – limestone, thatch and Collyweston slates. None of the windows are original.

# Description

- {1} House. Mid C18th and C19th. Squared coursed limestone and limestone ashlar with thatch and Collyweston slate roofs. Originally single-unit plan. 2 storeys with single-storey lean-to to either side. Gable abutting road has one-window range of casements, with glazing bars, under renewed wood lintels. Flanking lean-to extensions have similar windows. Gabled roof with catslides to either side, that to right has Collyweston slates. Side walls, each have a one-window range, with C19 style casements under wood lintel. Gable elevation to garden is ashlar, with a one-window range of tall casement windows with glazing bars, under stone lintels with keyblocks. C20 door to left. Stone stack at apex of gable. Interior probably remodelled C19 and C20.
- {3} Single rooom cottage of one storey and attic, extended on both sides. Thatched roof. C18th or C19th.
