No 6 Albert House, High Street, is an early eighteenth century two storey building, which was altered in the mid nineteenth century. It is constructed of coursed masonry rubble with ashlar dressings and a pantile roof with two red brick gable stacks. In early 18th century coach house (now used for storage) to the east of Albert House is included in the curtilage of its listing. {3}
