We had a survey of trees undertaken by Caroline Hall Arboriculture in August 2017 commissioned by Mercer tree services which is attached along with the appendices. Based on this Mercer tree services then applied to do various work on some of the trees and undertook this work. This included:

- 1) lifting the crown of the Robinia T2 (as labelled in the Tree survey) and removing dead wood;
- 2) Reducing the height of the Cypress conifers T2a surrounding the Robinia to improve its growth, and
- 3) lifting the crown of the oak tree T3.
- all of this work now needs redoing.

We have since separated what was the stable block annex to No 20 and converted it into a 3 bed bungalow, and the oak tree T3 is now in our neighbours' driveway at No 18 Chishill Road. We have informed them.

There are also some more conifers at corner of our plot adjacent to the shared driveway to Nos 18 and 16 which are overhanging their driveway which Mercer trees will lift and reduce the crowns - these are all under 75mm circumference at 1.5 m.

Photos of the Robinia and conifers are attached as a pdf showing the trees from the garden and from the road including the drive way to Nos 16 and 18 Chishill Road.

A sketch map marking the Robinia and conifers and the oak tree is also attached.

(We have also replanted trees and saplings that we had moved from elsewhere on the site and we now want to lift and reduce the crowns of the some of these; they are all under well 75mm at 1.5 m.)
