With reference to the planning discharge application detailed above, Public Protection (PP) comment as follows:

## Condition 17 states:

17. Before the development hereby approved is brought into use, a kitchen extract ventilation system incorporating:

- grease filtration / suppression and
- odour mitigation, attenuation\*, filtration and/or suppression

shall be installed in accordance with a scheme to be submitted to and approved by the Local Planning Authority

\*attenuation mechanisms may include for acceptable vertical discharge heights and subsequent diffusion / dissipation over appropriate distances, where relevant.

Thereafter the kitchen extract ventilation system shall be used and maintained in accordance with the approved scheme

In the interest of neighbour amenity and Policy P14 of the Solihull Local Plan.

PP confirm that the proposed kitchen extract scheme is acceptable on both noise and odour / air quality grounds.

- Kitchen extract equipment sits relatively central to the school estate and as such provides separation distances that are significant (and acceptable) with regard to the dissipation / dispersal of potential odours.
- Noise impacts have been predicted previously, as part of compliance with other conditions, and found to be acceptable.

Modelling of noise sources, to ensure that cumulative impacts are acceptable, includes impacts from the operation of kitchen extraction systems (see entry AHU and KET in 'Section 6.3 Plant Noise Data' of revised report 'Ref: Plant Noise Impact Assessment, 001478-MAL-XX-XX-RP-Y-9003, P03 - M&E data updated – A. Rodriguez 24/04/2023').

Kitchen extract hours of use (for both AHU and KET units) are stipulated as 08:00-18:00.

As such PP do not raise objection to the proposed kitchen extract scheme.

With regard to the discharge of the condition, PP note that safeguarding measures are specified in the condition. Such measures should remain in place to control future use / maintain relevant approval.
