Good Afternoon

Following on from our conversation over the phone last Thursday (17<sup>th</sup> August), I have not yet received the following information:

1) On the application form, it is stated that the two Lime trees in question are to have their crowns lifted, reduced, and thinned. Please could you provide an approximate measurement in feet or metres as to the amount each crown is to be lifted and reduced by (alternatively, this can be illustrated on photographs with a line depicting where each crown is to be lifted and reduced to).

As the trees are to have their crowns thinned, please could you provide the amount that you wish to thin the trees by as a percentage.

2) On the application form, you have ticked 'Yes' to the section "Condition of the tree(s) - e.g. it is diseased or you have fears that it might break or fall". Due to the trees being covered by a Tree Preservation Order, the application form states:

"If Yes, you are required to provide written arboricultural advice and other diagnostic information from an appropriate expert".

The arboricultural advice can either be sent via email directly from the tree surgeon or forwarded as an attachment/chain email. If the tree surgeon would prefer to provide handwritten advice to be sent in via post, please ensure that it is signed and dated by the surgeon and mentions the company they work for.

Please could you provide the above information by Friday 8<sup>th</sup> September 2023 as your current application will be automatically returned on this date and a new application will need to be submitted at a later date with all the required information.

If possible, please could you provide photographs of the two Lime trees that you wish to carry out work on as this would be most helpful to the case officer when assessing the proposed works.
