

Hi

I have left a message on Zoes answer phone but wanted to see if I can get permission for immediate pollarding.

We had a tree come down which we had to get retrospective planning for - see attached. When I emailed about the tree I said it had frightened us as it fell on to the main Walkington road through the village so I would get an arborist to come and look at the other large trees. Since then a branch has come down from the large Ash. (but on the garden side so no danger to the public)

The Tree People (Scott) came today and said the large Ash is potentially dangerous as two large holes in the tree. Both of us agree that we must try and save the tree so he he suggested pollarding it about half way up to get rid of the bad parts....it might not survive but we would give it the best chance of survival.

He checked all the other trees and was happy with their health but did suggest one of the oaks at the gatepost could do with a slight prune of a heavy branch over the road.

I have attached photos which show there is one branch hovering on the road side I have trimmed the bottom branches off it to make it smaller so that hopefully it lands on the verge - it is at the moment hung on a V.



And the damage in the tree - ie holes the first one would fall onto the road, the second one could fall either way....the idea would be to pollard underneath the damage to save as much of the tree as possible.



The size and position of the ash can be seen from this photo taken from the top of the drive



There is one more tree that the guys said was dead you can see on the zip file attached as had reached the limit on email. Think you can see it cannot be revived. This is on the drive as you go up on your left - i propose taking that down and replanting a new one.
