I will check if the wall forms part of the listing. If it does, then we can deal with it under the Urgent Works provision (information below).

Urgent works to a Listed Building

Urgent works to a listed building can be carried out without prior consent, under the provisions of S.9(3) of the Planning (Listed Buildings & Conservation Areas) Act 1990 without this being an offence, if you can prove all of the following:

• That detailed notice in writing justifying the carrying out the work was given to the council as soon as reasonably practical to do so.

It would be in the best interest of the owner (and a defence against accusations of carrying out unauthorised works), to write in advance and explain to the local planning authority exactly what the problem is, how extensive it is and what the intended course of action may be and the work will be undertaken in conformity with the provisions of S.9(3).

The work carried out should be limited to the minimum measures immediately necessary to make the structure safe (see above). You should set out clearly what these works are, in writing to the Council. If dismantling is required, please explain why other less harmful measures, such as temporary propping and/or cordoning off the area, was not an option.

We would request that you take photographs where safe to do so and retain materials on site for the time being.

If the wall is listed, an application for Listed Building Consent will be required for its dismantling and any future reinstatement as soon as is practicable.

In the meantime, because you have expressed concerns that the wall is dangerous, I have copied in our building control team. They may need your most accessible contact details (phone number ideally) so please can you provide them in case they wish to contact you tomorrow.

Good afternoon

I am writing on behalf of the Directors of the Management Company at Phillippines Shaw, Ide Hill, Kent, TN14 6AF. Following a survey by a specialist stone mason, we have been informed a wall sited on the estate is dangerous and needs immediate remedial work to prevent it falling down.

I have spoken with Historic England who have informed me it isn't on their site as being listed however referred me to yourselves for clarification.

- * The wall has been constructed of Kentish Ragstone and in some areas repaired with Sussex stone.
- * The wall has over the years been repaired with Limestone which we are informed is the correct mortar as this allows for contraction and expansion.
- * The cement mortar which has been used over many years besides not allowing for movement stops the water getting to the limestone which it needs to function, without access to rain it turns to powder and this is why the limestone mortar crumbles.

We intend having the repair work carried out using limestone.

If the wall is subject to a listing we should be very grateful if you were to grant us permission to attend to the remedial work at the earliest date to avoid any potential catastrophic accidents.

I attach photographs of the wall, the buildings behind it are garages that were constructed approximately 15 years ago.
