

Identification of Tree(s) and Description of Works

Please identify the tree(s) and provide a full and clear specification of the works you want to carry out

Ash tree (T11) - pollarding of tree subject to TPO which we have previously had consent to have work on felling of the tree with permission. It has come to our attention that the tree we have which is subject to the TPO is now showing signs of ash dieback. This has been expressed both by council representative whilst visiting the neighboring property with the purpose of identifying that their trees also had ash dieback and also by Arbocut the company our neighbors have used for all tree work. We are aware of the arboricultural guidance in the management of ash trees and health and safety implications to machine operators should this progress. Due to the logistics of the site, the cost impact in maintenance of the tree and the increased risk to health and safety of people and property we no longer believe or can afford that this is an acceptable risk and therefore wish to pollard our tree to reduce this risk to 10ft. This would enable us to manage the condition should it worsen without the need for specialist equipment that we simply could not afford and would therefore increase risk to ourselves as land owners and to neighboring properties which is no longer an acceptable manageable risk. Pollarding to 10ft is the recommendation given and granted to our neighboring property (45 and 47 Hillmorton Road) by both the Arbocut tree surgeon and also the council representative assigned to the TPO of this belt of trees.

You might find it useful to contact an arborist (tree surgeon) for help with defining appropriate work.

Sketch plan requirements

Your plan needs to show the precise location of the tree(s) in relation to nearby property/roads/boundaries. It should, therefore:

- indicate the main features of the site where the tree(s) stand and its surroundings; in particular, you should:
 - mark and name surrounding roads
 - o sketch in buildings, including adjoining properties
 - o add house numbers or names
- mark the position of the tree(s) to which you want to carry out work and identify them by the number shown in the Tree Preservation Order where possible; if you use a different number, please make sure that this can be matched with your description of the tree(s)
- if there are many trees on the site, make clear which tree(s) are included in this application by:
 - o marking all trees on the plan, but only numbering those to which you want to carry out work
 - $\circ\;$ showing the approximate distance between the application tree(s) and buildings
 - o adding other relevant features on the site (e.g. greenhouse, paths)
