Sorry for my belated reply. Please find below reasons for wanting to carry out the work.

We wish to reduce the trees crown by no more than 3 meters in height and spread to retain the tree and stop it from getting any larger. It has lots of over extended branches, particularly laterals which are getting a bit leggy and end heavy. The tree also has a few co dominant stems, some with included bark. To prevent any of these failing particularly in high winds, by reducing the canopy it will have less of a sail affect.

Also by reducing the tree this will allow more light to the houses and dropping less leaves, beech nuts and sap particularly over where the cars are parked.
