Further to your notification received on 27 September 2023, I am writing to inform you that, you may carry out the work to make safe or fell the tree/s in your five day notice, under Regulation 14 (a) (i) of The Town and Country Planning (Tree Preservation) (England) Regulations 2012 (which provides for the cutting down or making safe of a dead tree/s without a formal application being necessary).

Where a dead tree is removed under this exception, there is a duty on the landowner to plant a replacement tree of an appropriate size and species at the same place as soon as reasonably possible.

Please notify us when the new tree has been planted.

This letter does not convey any rights to enter upon land not in your ownership or to carry out any work on or over land not in your ownership without first obtaining the express consent of the owner of the land concerned.

All works should be carefully planned to avoid disturbing nesting birds and roosting bats. The disturbance of nesting birds and protected species is an offence under the Countryside and Wildlife Act 1981, and could result in prosecution, a criminal record and a substantial fine.
