Cherry blossom tree

We would like to remove a cherry tree that we planted 2 years ago from the left-hand bed at the front of the drive (when looking towards the road). It is becoming too big for the area and we we've been told that it (the roots) may contribute to problems with our drive, possibly now and also in the future. This was the same reason for successfully applying for the removal of a tree in the raised bed on the other side of the drive a few years ago.

We would also use this as an opportunity to remove the raised beds entirely. The right-hand bed has the remains of the tree felled a few years ago and is covered in gravel. The same is true of the bed where the cherry tree is located. The beds are retained by a wall which is approx 1-1.5' in height. The wall on the right-hand side is in need of some repair. Both are constructed from a brick type that does not look particularly nice.

Once hopefully removed, we would like to then get out driveway redone and in turn hugely smartened up. This is going to be costly but gives us the opportunity to install a much more aesthetically pleasing gravel driveway, in place of the current tarmac drive (section by laurels just soil/weeds - never tarmac'd), which has broken up in places and is bare soil and prone to weed growth.

By creating a larger gravel drive, this will also allow for better manoeuvring of vehicles without having to reverse into what is a very busy B road these days. Particularly as our eldest daughter will be legally able to drive next year and may eventually have her own car.
