An old and extensive Cupressus leylandii approximately 14 metres high, a radius of 5 metres and a girth diameter at chest height of 0.6 metres as estimated by Andrew Murray Tree Surgeon. Intergrown on the west side of the Cupressus is a similar size Holly, Ilex aquifolium.
The plan is to fell and remove the Cupressus and ideally the intergrown Holly completely and stump grind out the roots to provide a level

The plan is to fell and remove the Cupressus and ideally the intergrown Holly completely and stump grind out the roots to provide a level area..

The reason for this request is the Cupressus tree is now within 1 metre of the West end of the church and has already overgrown gravestones and broken the mounting for the floodlights for the west end windows. It is our view that the tree compromises the ability of the West end of the church wall to dry out and there is a potential threat to the foundations of the church.

You might find it useful to contact an arborist (tree surgeon) for help with defining appropriate work.
