The roots have caused structural damage to both the exterior and interior of the property. Most notably the downstairs flats toilet, currently are unable to use there bathroom. I have attached the quote and the findings from 'Fastfix Drainge and Plumbing LTD' which provides further information on this issue. The tree The tree is approximately 9 foot tall and is situated next to the front of the property. I have attached a Google Earth image with the tree circled red. I've also attached photographs of the tree where you can clearly see the exterior damage caused by the roots. We appreciate there is normally a six week waiting period on these applications, however, considering that the stress and inconvenience the tree is currently causing, all parties would be very grateful for a quick response.
