### **Dangerous or dead trees covered by a TPO or Con area**

The Town & Country Planning Tree Regulations 2012 state the following:

Although trees are protected by a TPO or if in a conservation area, this does not prevent the cutting down, topping, lopping, or uprooting of a tree which is either

- a) Dead or
- b) Urgently necessary to remove an immediate risk of serious harm (dangerous tree).

In the case of works urgently necessary to remove an immediate risk of serious harm, you/the tree owner are advised to seek appropriate expert advice (i.e., from a qualified tree surgeon) and report on the tree/s to confirm it's dangerous and to deal with it immediately, taking photos before and after. You/the owner is then required to advise us as soon as practicable after the works have been done by submitting an application along with the tree report, photos, etc.

In any other case (dead trees) advise us at least five working days

prior to the date on which the works are to be commenced.

You can use the TPO trees form to submit to us as either 'dangerous tree - after the works have been carried out' or as a 'Dead tree - 5-day notice'.
