

### Full Description and Reason for Works

There are a number of Silver Birches that have again overgrown since the last work by a tree surgeon. Our intent is to reduce the overall height of the clump by approximately 30% as they are now swaying significantly in the winter breezes. This will reduce windage and open up the views to the Church again from the entrance to the village. You will see from the photographs that one in particular has become unstable and is now leaning a lot. Subject to consultation with a tree surgeon it may be best to remove this as there is a strong chance of it falling. Should this happen it may well impact the church walls which being ancient may sustain damage too. I recall that in the past 2 others had to be removed because of crowding and unstable base
