Further to our telephone conversation this morning regarding my application to fell 3 Lime trees covered by TPO 01/2001.

Please accept this email of 5 day notice to fell trees 4,5 and 6 as shown on previously supplied sketch plan from previous application F/YR21/0090/TRTPO.

As I have now carried out a closer inspection of these trees they are clearly dead and have become unstable and urgently require felling to remove risk of harm to the tree owner and also damage to the neighbouring boundary wall.

I have attached further photos showing the condition and state of decay to the trees.
