

Heritage Statement Glebe Cottage ref: PP-12194615

Glebe cottage lies adjacent to St Peters Church and the former rectory (now known as Heroncourt) in Zeal Monachorum and, until the twentieth century, was the property of the church, known variously as Rectory Farm or Glebe Farm.

Apart from a couple of conveyance documents from the 60's the owners parents were given no other information when they bought the cottage in the 70's. The current owner has contacted the south west heritage centre in Exeter to try and find out more from church records about the historical development including the date it was built.

According to the listing entry on Historic England's website, the cottage is probably late 18th century to early 19th century incorporating a barn converted C1960; plastered cob on rubble footings with stone rubble/cob stacks topped with 19th and 20th century bricks; thatched roof. The cottage faces South South East with, with the east end stack projecting from the wall. The cottage overlooks the garden which was originally the orchard, and at the west end is an area which was presumably the farm yard for the animals.
