BAT SURVEY REQUIRED*

The structure and location of your proposal indicates that there is a reasonable likelihood of a bat roost which may be affected by your development proposal. A bat survey will be required before your application can be validated. This must meet the 'Minimum Standards for Bat Surveys in West Yorkshire' (<https://www.wyjs.org.uk/media/1367/150603-minimum-standards-for-bat-surveys-version-5-draft-lp.pdf>) and other current best practice guidance and be undertaken by a licensed bat worker. These guidelines will normally require dawn or dusk surveys to be undertaken between May and September. However, where a winter survey establishes that there is limited bat roost potential or that adverse impacts can be avoided, a dawn or dusk survey may not be required.

PHOTOGRAPHIC GUIDANCE

Photographs should be of high resolution, sharp and light enough to enable any finger sized gaps to be identified. Wherever possible, they should be submitted electronically. They need to provide complete coverage of all areas (internal and external) of structures (including trees, buildings, walls etc), affected by the proposals. It is helpful, particularly for large or complex developments, for the photographs to be labelled / annotated in relation to the proposals.
