## Identification of Tree(s) and Description of Works

TPO 19A Beech tree (Fagus sylvatica)in the front garden, is based on us carrying out a selective crown thin of 15%, separating branches competing for light showing Lion Tails effect, and a crown Lift removing the lower limbs which are also showing Lion Tails effect, due to the weight of the branches being solely on the tips of the branches due to such a dense crown and remove any deadwood within the crown. The work will ensure a safer crown, enable light to penetrate the crown to promote foliage within the crown, and reduce any windsale effect.

Beech tree (Fagus sylvatica) in the Rear garden application to do a minimal crown lift on the Beech tree (Fagus sylvatica), in the rear garden, to remove weak sucker growth and 2 x low limbs head height, and affecting Garden, low hanging branches.

You might find it useful to contact an arborist (tree surgeon) for help with defining appropriate work.
