Hello,

Thank you for your recent response to a planning application we have made regarding the installation of a air source heat pump.

I am confused with the reasons given at point 7 on the attached document regarding trees.

'7. As there are protected trees on or adjacent to the site, we require a tree survey to show the location of the trees and if any are within 15m of the proposed works, an Arboricultural Implications Statement and / or Arboricultural Method Statement. This should follow the guidance in British Standard 5837-2012 Trees in relation to design, demolition and construction. The survey plan should;- Identify the species of tree and their dimensions- Identify the impact the tree has (if any)- Identify any tree proposed to be removed (if any)The Arboricultural Implications Statement and / or Arboricultural Method Statement should set out;- Measures needed to protect the trees shown to be retained- Schedules of any necessary tree work- Proposals for long-term maintenance- It should also include any trees on adjacent sites affected by the works See also Our Ref: 23/02324/HOU Case Officer: Validation Team Tel. The air source heat pump is to be installed on the patio 300mm away from the outside wall of the house. It is replacing the current gas boiler with a energy efficient heat source with 0 carbon emissions as part of the government drive to a carbon neutral future. No ground will be broken. There is also a brick wall (boundary) that is in between the location of the trees in area G4,G5 found on document 8600237HDC attached. Is it still required to have a tree survey?

### Mitigation measures

Mitigation measures will depend on the type of development. They could include:

- putting up screening barriers to protect ancient woodland or ancient and veteran trees from dust and pollution

- measures to reduce noise or light

- designing open space to protect ancient or veteran trees

- rerouting footpaths and managing vegetation to deflect trampling pressure away from sensitive locations

creating buffer zones
