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## Identification of Tree(s) and Description of Works

Please identify the tree(s) and provide a full and clear specification of the works you want to carry out

W1 (G1), 5 x Oak trees and 1 Beech, around teh main property, crown lft trees around building back to previous points, 6-6.5m form ground level, cutting no greater than 100mm to NGP and branch bark collars at stem. Beech lateral growth on South side overhanging gardens to be lifted to match North side 6-6.5m, reducing remaining lateral growth on Noth side by 3m cutting no greater than 100mm to NGP crown spread from 8m to 5m

T1440 - Beech, Reduce Sub dominent eastern stem by approx. 4 metres by removing 3-4 dominant stems.

• Install 4 ton flexible bracing system between three stems in a triangular formation at approx. 12-14m in height.

T1441 - Oak, Coppice or monolith at approx. 6 metres in height. Twin stemmed tree leaning over track and footpath with significant decay at base.

T1442 - Oak, Small dead tree near cabin. Reduce to deadwood monolith at approx. 7-8 m

T1444 - Beech, Install 6-8 ton steel cable brace, using stainless steel bolts and cables at 3-5 metres above union between two main stems, Main trunk bifurcation at approx, 4 m with included union and cracking/ bark movement at union.

- Cavities partially occluded on western aspect of main trunk with decay.
- Decay appears to extend up through main trunk to weakened fork.

You might find it useful to contact an arborist (tree surgeon) for help with defining appropriate work.

- mark the position of the tree(s) to which you want to carry out work and identify them by the number shown in the Tree Preservation Order where possible; if you use a different number, please make sure that this can be matched with your description of the tree(s)
- if there are many trees on the site, make clear which tree(s) are included in this application by:
  - o marking all trees on the plan, but only numbering those to which you want to carry out work
  - showing the approximate distance between the application tree(s) and buildings
  - o adding other relevant features on the site (e.g. greenhouse, paths)
