Please note that none of the trees in this request are subject to a tree preservation order.

A mature Ash tree is affected by Ash die back, the tree overhangs Low Cross Lane and a neighbour's property and is beginning to drop branches, thus representing a danger to the public. The tree is on our property boundary and is marked on the Newcroft boundaries document. We request permission to have the tree felled. The wood will be destroyed on site so as not to spread the disease to any nearby Ash trees.

A second tree that needs to be removed is a smaller, Silver Birch, that is dead. The location of the tree is against our property boundary and is shown on the Newcroft boundaries document. The tree is very close to the power and telecommunication lines to our house, should it fall it will fall on these power lines. The tree will also be destroyed on site so as to prevent transmission of any disease.

We also wish to remove a Leylandii hedge, planted next to the wall of a walled garden, that the previous owner allowed to get too tall. Its current height is approximately 6m. The location of the hedge is shown on the Newcroft boundaries document, and lies entirely within the boundaries of our property. The wood would be destroyed on site.

A tree surgeon report to confirm the condition of the trees can be provided if required.

You might find it useful to contact an arborist (tree surgeon) for help with defining appropriate work.
