Lawson cypress cv G1: Fell Portuguese laurel G2: Fell English oak, leaning at 45 degrees, heavily supressed, poor T3: Fell Goat willow T4: Fell Hawthorn T5: Fell Myrobalan plum T6: Fell Goat willow T7: Fell Horse chestnut T8: Crown lift to provide a 2.0m clearance over the shed. Portuguese laurel and rhododendron G10: Remove all immediately adjacent to driveway All trees and shrubs to be remove are marked with orange ribbon.

We want to clear the space out, allow the better specimens to thrive, and re-establish the grass, maybe with a wildflower mix and some naturalised bulb planting. There will be a veg garden (not yet sure where exactly) and we may plant some additional trees, perhaps hazel and birch, both do well on the site, maybe a hawthorn or two as well, and some beech.

You might find it useful to contact an arborist (tree surgeon) for help with defining appropriate work.
