If the planning authority needs to make an appointment to carry out a site visit, whom should they contact?

In relation to the single storey infill extension, it is estimated that this would result in approximately a ~40% footprint increase. This extension alone would be considered appropriate within the Green Belt and would not harm the openness of the site.

Design and Layout:

The extensions and alterations proposed to the dwelling are considered to complement the existing character and appearance of the existing dwelling house and surrounding area.

It is considered that the proposed extensions would not dominate the existing dwelling house, nor would they detract from the rural character of the area. They have been well-designed to make the best possible use of the site.

The infill extension would be of limited extent and would benefit the ground floor layout of the property. The upwards extension to create the first-floor accommodation will integrate dormers to the front and rear elevations. Policy HOU11 states '(d) roof dormers may be acceptable if appropriate to the design and character of the dwelling and its surroundings. Dormers should generally be of limited extent and modest proportions, so as not to dominate the existing roof form.' The proposed dormers are considered to be of modest proportion, and do not dominate the roof slopes. Therefore, their inclusion would be considered acceptable from a design perspective.

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In order to accommodate a first-floor, the height of the dwelling will need to increase. Within the document supplied with this application, it is stated that this increase would be approximately 1m. It is not considered that this increase would detract significantly from the character of the surrounding area. It is understood that this would allow the dwelling to be more prominent above the existing hedge line, therefore more readily visible to the public realm, however this is not considered to be detrimental. The character of the property shall remain the same, and this will not dominate the area.

It is understood the development would include the alteration of external materials to the dwelling, integrating a soft green cladding (coastline composite cladding) and a small section of brick courses. The material alterations would be considered acceptable. They would not detract from the character of the area and would reflect a high standard of design.

The design can generally be considered acceptable; however, following from the Green Belt discussions above, the extent of the extensions may have impact upon the openness of the Green Belt.

Neighbour amenity:

Due to this distance, it is not considered that any detrimental issues to the amenity of neighbouring occupiers shall arise from this development. Issues such as overbearing impacts, loss of light, overshadowing or harm to outlook would not be applicable. The proposal would therefore comply with policy DES4(c).
