Identification of Tree(s) and Description of Works

Please identify the tree(s) and provide a full and clear specification of the works you want to carry out

Tree T1 is a prominent Copper Beech which is believed to be over 130 years old and subject to TPOP1/201/304. It is in good health but is very large and is located close to the road and to the property. There is evidence of significant lateral branch loading which needs to be addressed and the overall size of the tree requires proactive management. The tree was last treated 10 years ago with consented works from GBC (13/T/00255).

Given that Copper Beech shows more tolerance to pruning than Common Beech Ben Nicholson Tree Services have recommended a) a crown reduction of 20% to improve health, vigour, aesthetical value and to alleviate the risk of lateral branch failure. This will reduce weight, stress and sail activity and b) a crown thinning procedure of 10%. A full canopy inspection will be carried out to identify and remove dead, crossing or defective branches

Tree T2 is a small sycamore that lies within both the RPA of the Copper Beech and is in poor condition. It is strongly asymmetric, well out of plumb and appears stressed with stunted growth. It is of little aesthetical value and impacts on views of tree T1. Removal is proposed
