

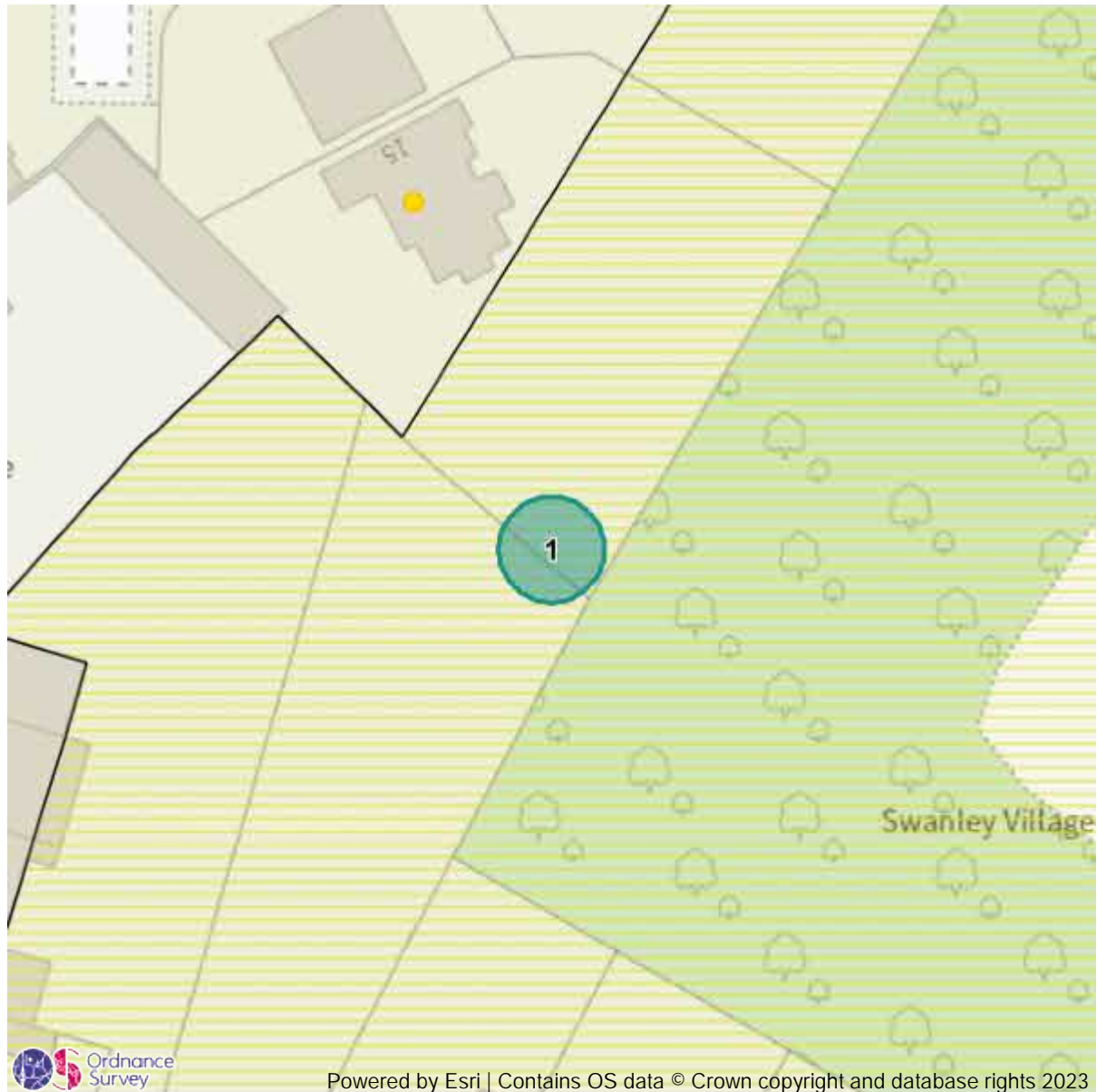

General Works

We propose to fell a holly tree within our garden which has died, either as a result of fungal infection or some damage which occurred to the tree before we bought the property. The fungal infection/damage has resulted in the loss of a significant amount of bark near the base of the tree and a significant portion of the centre of the tree is rotten. Due to the shape of the tree which has notable a lean, at some stage the tree will fall onto our shed.

We do not propose to replant a tree in the location of the holly tree as there is a leylandii about 10 yards away which is at least 35 feet high, and there are well established, mature border plants and a well established, mature hedgerow only a few feet from the location of the holly tree, which block much of the light to the area. Thus we think it unlikely that a replacement tree planted in this area will survive.
