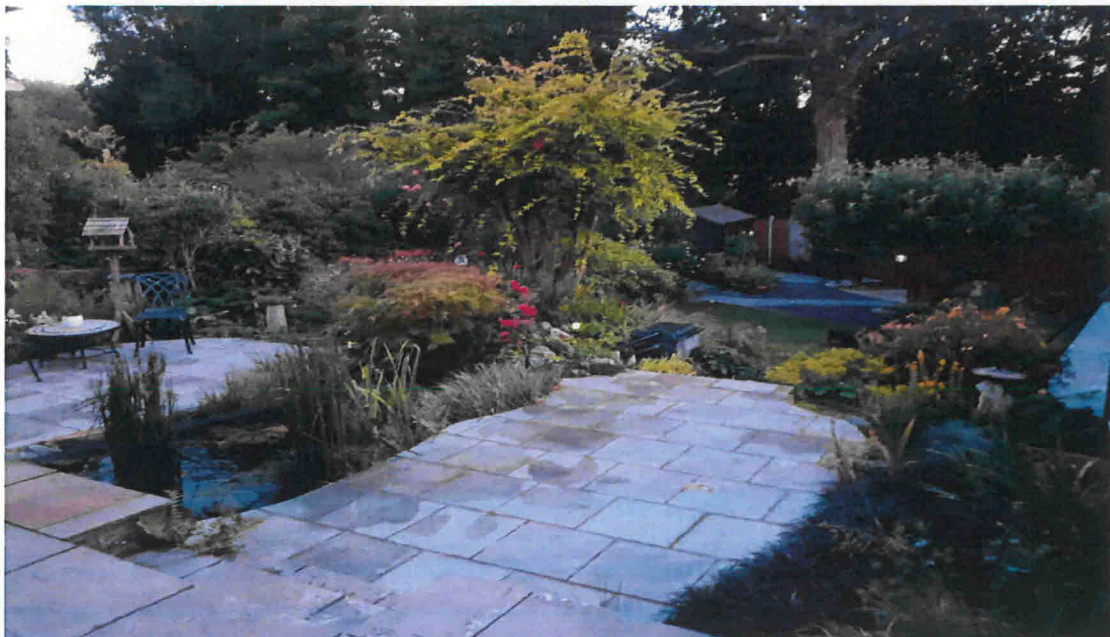
Heritage statement

After inspecting the laurel hedge at-

I can confirm it has developed powdery mildew, leaf spot fungi and bacterial shothole.

Sadly, the hedge is very old and diseased, and the fence is in poor repair therefore we would recommend removal of the hedge and existing fence .

If agreed, I would like to quote for a replacement.

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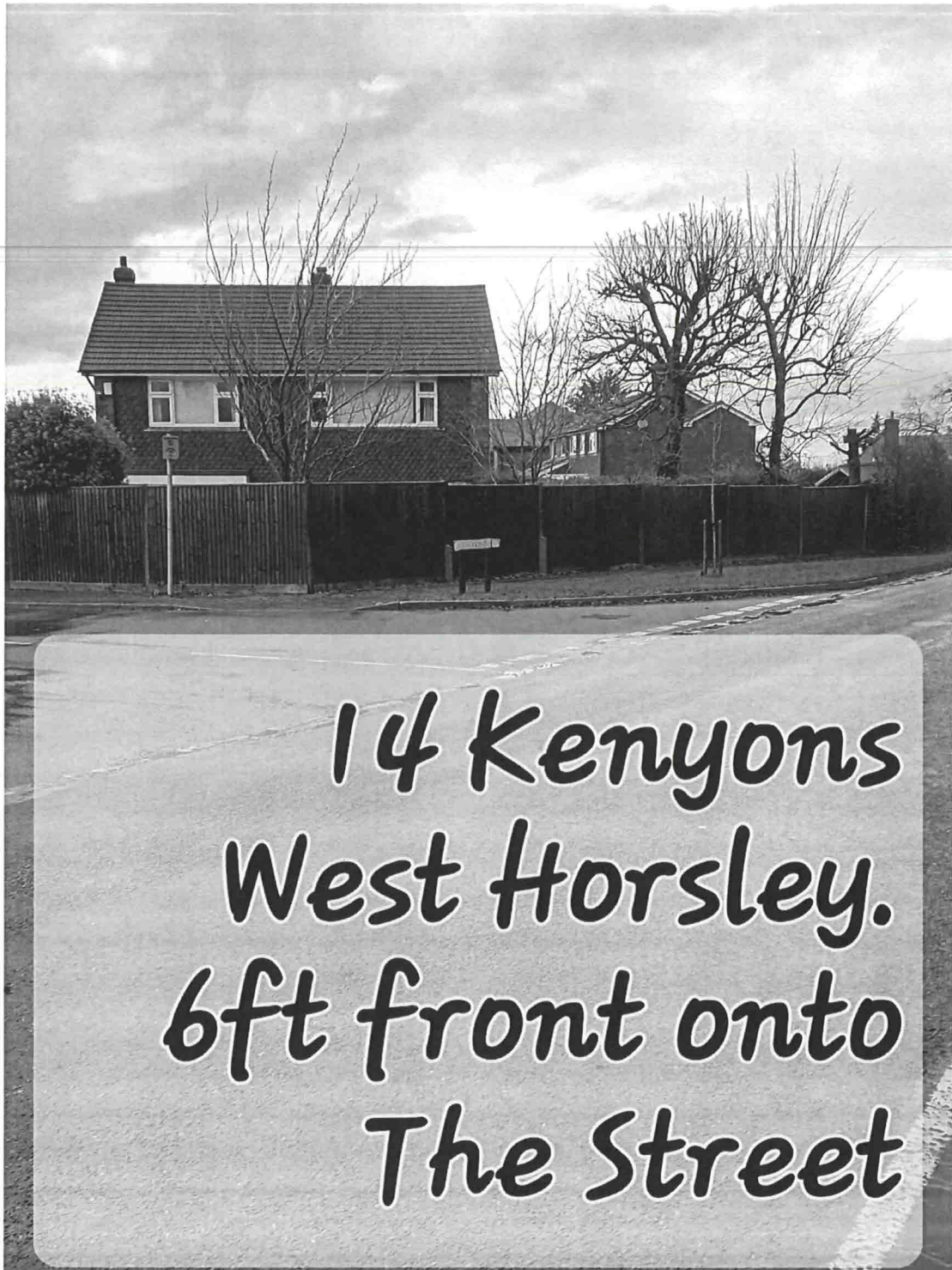
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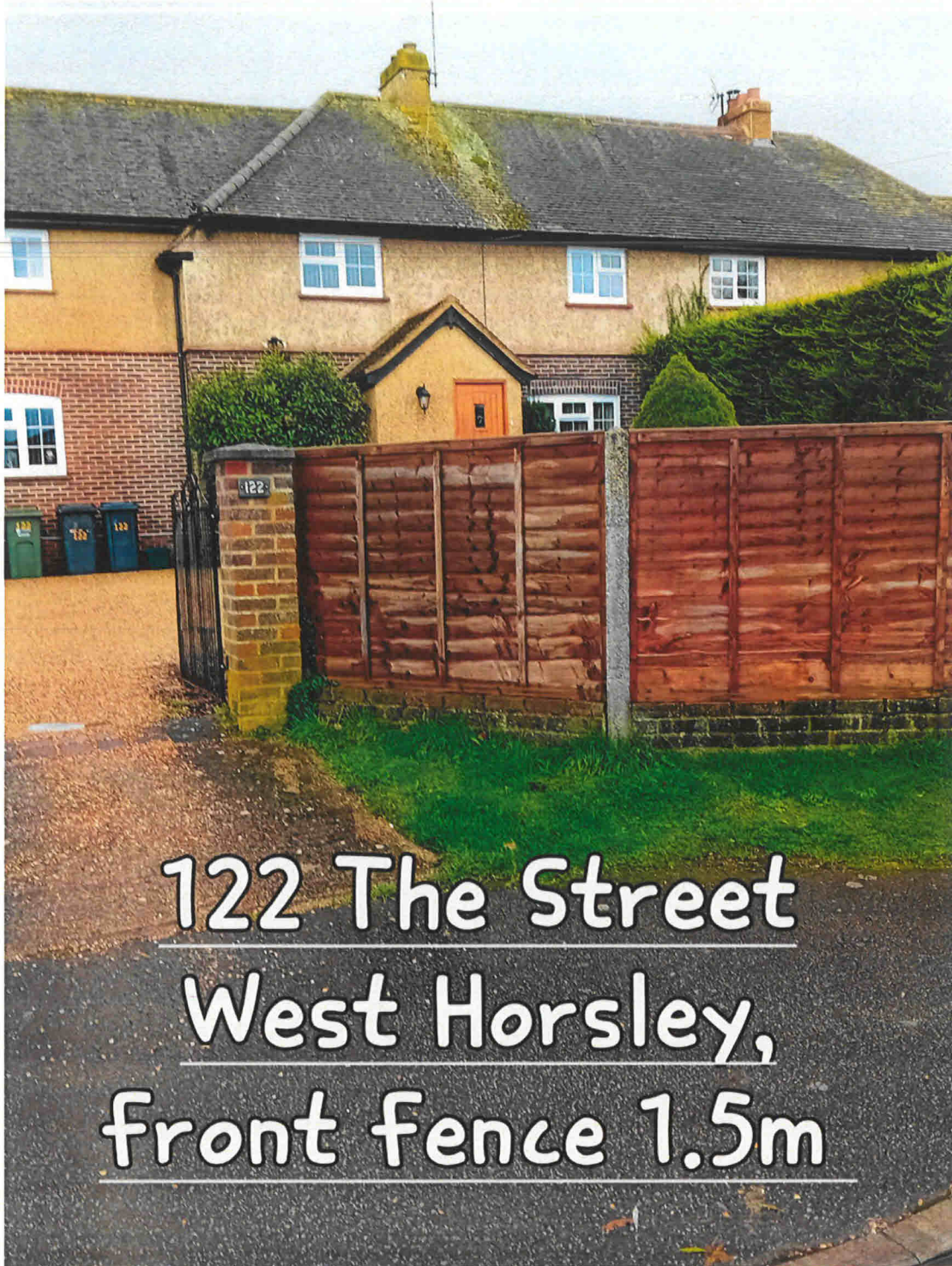

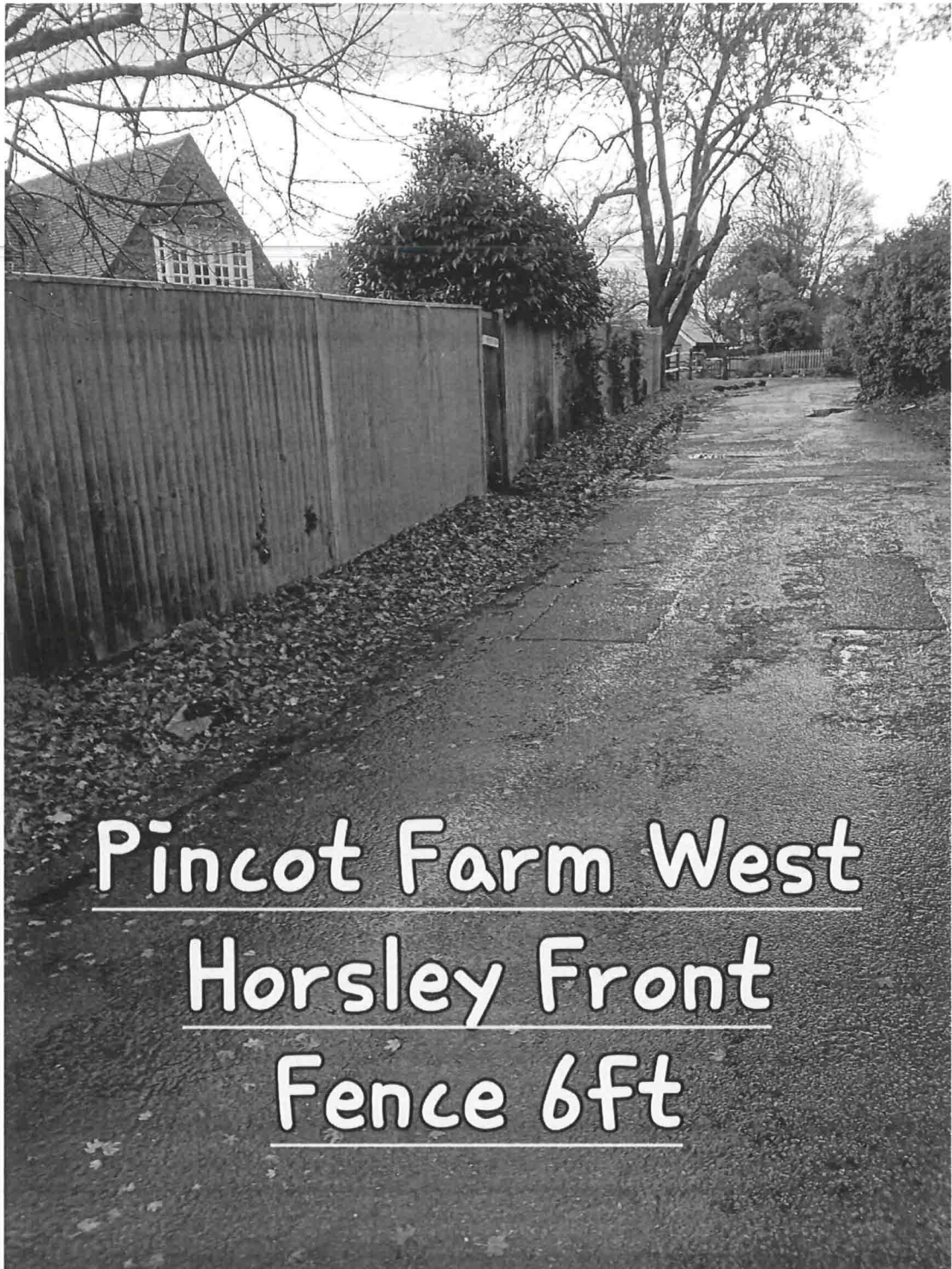
