Thank you for your application.

On the application form, it is stated that branches growing into the Oak tree from the Beech tree are to be trimmed. Please could you provide an approximate measurement in feet or metres as to the amount the branches are to be reduced by (alternatively, this can be illustrated on photographs with a line depicting where the crown is to be reduced to).

Furthermore, due to the trees being under a Tree Preservation Order, please could you provide a reason for the proposed works.

In addition, due to the trees being under a TPO, the questions in section 8 of the application form must be ticked yes or no. I have listed them below:

8.1 - Is the tree(s) in question diseased or do you have fears that it might break or fall? Yes or No?

Other structural damage (e.g. drains, walls and hard surfaces) - Written technical evidence from an appropriate expert, including description of damage and possible solutions".

Please could you provide the above information via email at your earliest convenience as I am unable to proceed with the validation of your application without it.

Please note that the removal of dead branches does not require ERYC's permission and therefore will not appear in the description of the proposed work on the acknowledgement letter once the application has been validated.
