Summary of work

T7 English Oak – Crown Reduction - Up to 2 metres reduction of south-west primary lateral branch. Current height approximately 14 metres. Bifurcates at 2 metres, included bark union with minor adaptive growth. South-west primary lateral over neighbouring garden at 5-6 metres and end-weighted. Reason for work: To reduce back from neighboring garden.

T12 Englich Oak – Crown Reduction - Up to 2 metres reduction of east primary branch. Current height approximately 14 metres. East primary branch end-weighted over playground slide. Reason for work: Weight reduction in high target area.

T13 Ash – To remove 2 x defective branches. Current height approximately 14 metres. One broken branch to the north sitting in the adjacent Oak. One west lower branch broken from recent nearby tree works. Reason for work: Suspected squirrel damage that has already led to a branch failure.

T15 Sessile Oak - Crown Reduction – Up to 2 metres reduction of the north canopy. Current height approximately 19 metres. Reason for work: maintenance pruning over high target area (playground).

T19 Sessile Oak – Crown Reduction - Up to 3 metres reduction back to previous reduction points. Current height approximately 18 metres. Tight union at 0.5 metre and minor to moderate adaptive growth. Some decay visible to east - shallow. East stem is leaning east and has been partially reduced over the play equipment. Reason for work: Overall reduction to balance the canopy as previously only cut back over the playground.

T20 Ash – Crown Reduction - To reduce the overall canopy by up to 2 metres to include removing the lowest north lateral. Current height approximately 6 metres. Dog leg stem and bent to the north then up righted higher and bending slightly to north-east. Reason for work: Overall reduction to balance the canopy.

T27 Ash - To carefully section fell as close to ground level as possible and neatly stack in a habitat pile. Current height approximately 17 metres. Reason for work: Dead standing tree.

You might find it useful to contact an arborist (tree surgeon) for help with defining appropriate work.
