2 All approved work shall be carried out in accordance with BS 3998:2010 "British Standard Recommendations for Tree Work" and all subsequent arboricultural best practice guidance.

Reasons for the conditions are:

- 1 To ensure that the approved work is carried out within a reasonable timescale.
- In the interests of good arboricultural practice and to ensure a satisfactory standard of workmanship.

Notes to applicant

1. Trees are often used by bats, owls and nesting birds for roosting and nesting. Nesting birds and bats, their roosts and their access to these roosts are protected by Law under the Wildlife and Countryside Act 1981 (with amendments),

When work is carried out on a tree, we recommend that the tree is visited and inspected for the presence of bats and bird by a trained operative before works are commenced.

Should bats, owls or nesting birds be discovered in the tree concerned in the application, Natural England must be informed immediately and no works permitted until necessary mitigation measures have been put in place.
