


In response to your letter dated 3 January i would like to clarify that the 4m crown lift is to facilitate 4m clearance from ground level yes with the further caveat that i will not be removing primary limbs if they are below 4m. The lateral reduction is in order to draw the tree away from the building and it is to reduce the tree by 2m but it this is a maximum for some of the furthest reaching branches and much of the reduction will not be as much as 2m

I hope that answers your questions
