## Identification of Tree(s) and Description of Works

T1 - Ash - Fell

The tree works are proposed to stop the influence of the tree(s) on the soil below building foundation level and provide long term stability.

Estimated costs of repair to the building £1900.00 if the tree is removed and will increase if the tree remains Granting permission will limit these costs. In the event of a refusal we, or our clients, will seek to secure compensation for the additional costs incurred through Section 202(e).

Should the tree/s remain the total cost of repairs will be the Superstructural repairs + Alternative method of repairs

It is the expert opinion of both the case engineer and arboriculturalist that on the balance of probabilities the supporting information demonstrates the influence of the tree(s).

Note: Further monitoring results may be submitted if these become available during the course of this application.

You might find it useful to contact an arborist (tree surgeon) for help with defining appropriate work.

Where trees are protected by a Tree Preservation Order, please number them as shown in the First Schedule to the Tree Preservation Order where this is available. You should use the same numbering on your sketch plan (see below for sketch plan requirements).
