Identification of Tree(s) and Description of Works

Specification

T.1 Scots Pine (C) Crown lift to approximately 6m

Reasons for the proposed works are listed and numbered below

1. The proposed works will help to prevent future conflict with the gardens.

2. The pruning will be carried out in accordance with the guidelines in BS3998, is therefore is a appropriate recognised pruning technique and should be allowed to be carried on to all trees to alleviate problems and conflicts

3. The pruning will only remove an estimated <5% of the total leaf area of the tree and therefore the overall effect on the tree will be minimal.

4. The pruning will allow more light into the garden and property.

5. The area has plenty of tree cover and therefore any loss of visual amenity will be minimal.

6. The trees vitally is good and therefore the pruning will not have a significant detrimental effect to overall condition of the tree.

7. The pruning will improve the relationship between the tree and its location.

8. Because the house screens the tree the branches removed will only be noticeable from one or two public places and you will have to look hard to see they are missing, therefore the loss of visual amenity for the local landscape will be minimal.

9. The tree has grown significantly since the TPO was placed on it and I feel it is reasonable for the home owners to request pruning to raise the canopy and allow more light underneath to allow other species to develop.

Summary

The proposed works will make significant difference to Clients use and enjoyment of their garden and will help to prevent future conflicts between the trees and the property.

The reasons 1.-9. are all credible reasons, to justify the works, in their own right and all far out way the any loss of any visual amenity.

You might find it useful to contact an arborist (tree surgeon) for help with defining appropriate work.

- if there are many trees on the site, make clear which tree(s) are included in this application by:

 - $\circ\;$ showing the approximate distance between the application tree(s) and buildings
 - adding other relevant features on the site (e.g. greenhouse, paths)
