Two large ash trees to pollard down to main forks (around 15/20ft) these trees are showing signs of decline and are poor quality. they have large cavities around the base and both showing signs of Inonotus Hispdus fungal brackets which will effect the trees structural integrity. the trees overhang a public and well used footpath. A pollard will insure the trees are safe but also allow foliage to re generate, retaining the trees. The Alnus tree is just to remove any large deadwood.
You might find it useful to contact an arborist (tree surgeon) for help with defining appropriate work.
