

Full Description and Reason for Works

We have a large leylandii tree at the bottom corner of our garden that we wish to remove. The tree was originally part of the leylandii hedge along the rear boundary at the end of the garden and has been allowed to grow by the previous owner. The tree is growing at an angle with a very curved trunk leaning on the garden fence. We wish to remove the tree along with the whole hedge - see planning application reference 2023/1276/FUL which includes replacement of the existing leylandii hedging with hazel hurdles and new evergreen hedging, which without removal of the tree will hinder the installation of the sustainable fencing and planting.
