Introduction

- 1. The application is for the change of use from HMO C4 to Sui Generis (Large HMO)
- 2. The application site consists of a modestly sized two storey property with ample amenity area to the rear.

The Site

- 3. The site is situated on the northern side of North Road within the borough of Dartford.
- 4. The site is comprised of a Sui Generis (Large HMO).
- 5. The property, as it stands provides 6 bedrooms and one communal kitchen.
- 6. The immediate area is predominantly residential of similarly sized dwellings.
- 7. The site is not situated in an Conservation Area and the building is neither locally nor statutorily listed.
- 8. The property enjoys previous extensions at ground floor and loft through PD rights.

The Proposal

- 1. The proposal converts the largest room, Room 3, to a communal lounge for the use of Rooms 1, 2, 4, 5 & 6.
- 2. The internal alteration would allow for two people to accommodate each room sufficiently as all rooms exceed the 10.22sqm required.
- 3. The resulting Large HMO would allow for an occupancy of 10 persons.
- 4. The lounge would be sufficient in size and allow the occupants to have direct access to the rear garden.
- 5. The expected increased of 4 persons provide additional refuse arrangements as indicated on the plans.
- 6. There is no specific requirement for cycle parking for Sui Generis development, nonetheless secure cycle storage is provided to promote and encourage green travel.

8. The development will invite a communal living space whilst not having any detrimental effect on the host or neighbouring properties. The Council is therefore respectfully asked to grant permission.
